Via the Multifamily Investment Loan, the City encourages landlords to reinvest in older rental apartment buildings to create affordable housing opportunities for residents.

#### c. Old Towne Enterprise Zone

Provides real property and state income tax credits for businesses located in a Maryland enterprise zone in return for job creation and investments.

Businesses may also qualify for personal property tax credits on new investment in personal property and enhanced income tax credit for creating new jobs.

#### 3. Montgomery County MOVE Program

Small businesses that occupy their firstclass A or B office space or flex space with a wet lab in Montgomery County (<20,000 square feet) may receive a one-time \$8/ square foot incentive. Contact MCEDC.

#### 4. Rockville Economic Development

The City of Rockville has created programs intended to supplement the County's incentive. New businesses that move into Rockville or expand within the City may take advantage of an additional \$4/square foot incentive.

Open to businesses currently located in the City looking to expand into a minimum of 1,000 square feet of space. The grant provides up to \$5 per square feet for additional space occupied, up to \$20,000.
